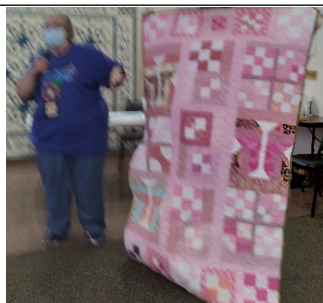

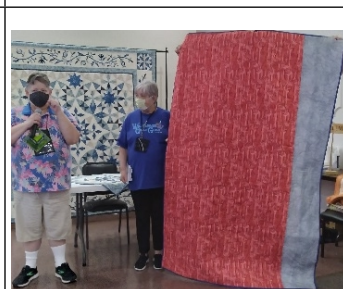

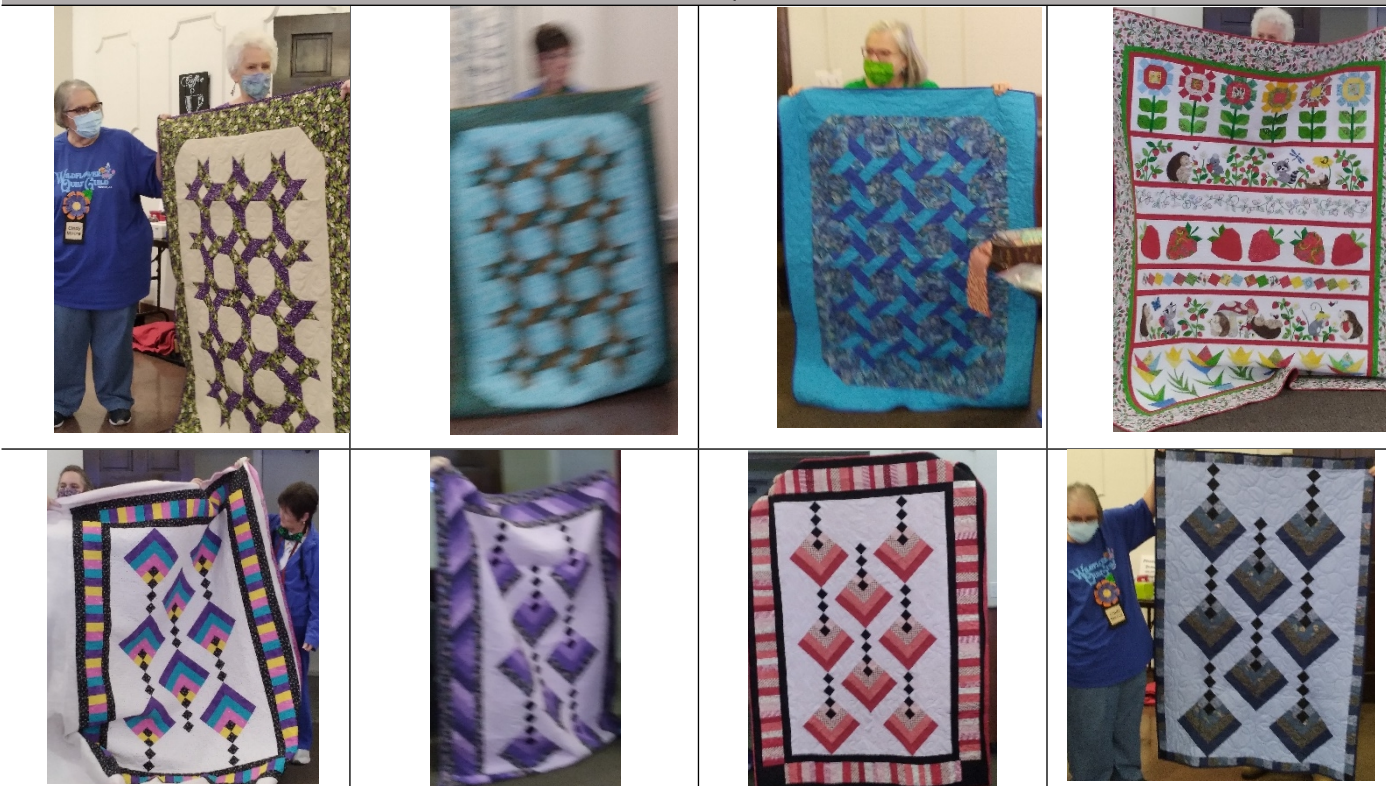

BLOCK OF THE MONTH



This month we will be working with soft PASTEL colors & white. Suggested colors: light yellow, blue, pink, green, purple. Think Easter!

We will be making a simple 9 patch block. You will cut each square 3 ½ inches & sew them together to create a 9 ½ unfinished block. Arrange the squares with 5 colored blocks (C) & 4 white blocks (W) as seen to the right.

We will exchange the blocks as we have in the past.

CHARM SQUARES SWAP



Guidelines for Charm Square Swap

Every month, (or any months you want to) bring 25 squares 5" sizes in a plastic bag with your name on the front. During the meeting we will mix up the squares with others that brought squares & then after the meeting pick up your bag to take home 25 new charm squares.

Each month will have a new Charm Square Theme as shown below:

♥ Apr	weather prints & colors, rain, umbrellas & clouds	♥ May	yellow	♥ June	Patriotic prints/colors

Any member who wants to contribute please bring items listed below in good quality quilting fabric. Please place loose fabric, cut down to sizes listed below, & fat quarters in a quart size labeled baggies.

If you don't have a baggie at home no problem, I will have some at meeting. If you are not able to cut down to size no problem, I can take it home & cut it down for next time.

- ♥ 1 panel piece (in baggie)
- ♥ 1 yd spaced-out prints (in baggie)
- ♥ ½ yard of material (in baggie)
- ♥ 2 Fat Quarters (in baggie)
- ♥ 2. 5" Charm Square
- ♥ 10" Layer cake
- ♥ Jelly roll
- ♥ 5" Charm Square

Getting Your Raffle ticket

- ♥ Stop at the Birthday Table to drop off fabric &/or enter your tickets into the members' box. This is a great way to grow your fabric stash.
- ♥ **Birthday Month Members** get 1 free ticket in the birthday box.
- ♥ **Anyone who brings fabric** as listed above gets 1 free ticket in the members box for each item.
- ♥ **Non-fabric ticket** is 25¢ (no limit is set) ticket goes into the members box & money into the operations account to help fund programs & workshops.

A-1 Repair Sewing & Vac Center is located at **719 S 13th, Temple, Tx.** at the corner of Ave. H & 13th. Phone # is 254-771-1112 & hours are **Mon-Fri 9am-5:30pm**. They are a Sewing machine Repair Store that works on several different Antique & Current Sewing Machines & even a few Computerized Sewing Machines. Kat has been working here for the past 13 yrs. & now owns the business. She charges \$45 to analyze any problems & will call you with a repair cost before work starts. Kat tries to give either a 3 or 6 month warranty on her work depending on the repairs done. At the moment she is backup till August.

Aunt Ree's Quilt Shop is an Online store started last fall by Guild member Marie Adams. She has a website auntreesquiltshop.com & Facebook page. Marie is hoping to have a brick-n-mortar store in **Salado, Tx** in the future but for now you can order online or if local call 254-307-2625 for an appointment for in-person shopping from **Mon-Fri 8am-5pm**. If you place an on-line order & are local Marie says she can either have you do a pick-up or meet you somewhere to save you on shipping.
