She started quilting seriously about 20 years ago & was amazed when she used her Serger for the 1<sup>st</sup> time to piece a table runner at how beautifully the squares & rows matched.

Barbara is a retired teacher of 43 years, and for the last 25 years has taught machine embroidery, digitizing, Serger classes, Scan-N-Cut classes, and sewing for children.

**On Wednesday, May 19,** she will present a **workshop on “Sergers Piecing”**. The workshop will be held at **Variety’s Peaceable Kingdom, 29051 FM2484, Killeen, Texas**. 

This is a great way to clean out your stash of unwanted fabric, so you have more room for fabric that is new to you. Any member who wants to contribute please bring items listed below in good quality quilting fabric. Please place loose fabric, cut down to sizes listed below, & fat quarters in a quart size labeled baggies.

If you don't have a baggie at home no problem, I will have some at meeting. If you are not able to cut down to size no problem, I can take it home & cut it down for next time.

- ♥ 1 panel piece (in baggie)
- ♥ 1 yd spaced-out prints (in baggie)
- ♥ ½ yard of material (in baggie)
- ♥ 2 Fat Quarters (in baggie)
- ♥ 2. 5" Charm Square
- ♥ 10" Layer cake
- ♥ Jelly roll
- ♥ 5" Charm Square

### Getting Your Raffle ticket

- ♥ Stop at the Birthday Table to drop off fabric &/or enter your tickets into the members' box. This is a great way to grow your fabric stash.
- ♥ **Birthday Month Members** get 1 free ticket in the birthday box.
- ♥ **Anyone who brings fabric** as listed above gets 1 free ticket in the members box for each item.
- ♥ **Non-fabric ticket** is 25¢ (no limit is set) ticket goes into the members box & money into the operations account to help fund programs & workshops.


## QUILT CHALLENGES

I also will need someone to coordinate these challenges. So, if you miss the quilt challenges, consider volunteering to help out in 2022.

### WQG (WILDFLOWER QUILT GUILD) STARS OF 2021 CHALLENGE

Things have continued to change & evolve with our WQG Stars of 2021 Challenge. This challenge will consist of **(9) 9 1/2" blocks & EVERY** block must be a different "star" block. You have the option to pick your own star block each month, or I will choose a block to share & have instructions for those who feel so inclined. We will not be trading the blocks as originally planned. The finished quilts will be shared in January 2022.


This month is the **OHIO STAR**, a time-honored favorite.



#### Fabric Needed:

- Fabric 1 – White
- Fabric 2 – Same as 4 or coordinating
- Fabric 3 – Solid or Print for Contrast
- Fabric 4 – Print

Sew together along red lines.



#### Fabric 1

- Cut 1 square 4 1/4" & bisect on both diagonals
- Cut 4 squares 3 1/2"

#### Fabric 2

- Cut 1 square 4 1/4" & bisect on both diagonals

#### Fabric 3

- Cut 2 squares 4 1/4" & bisect on both diagonals

#### Fabric 4

- Cut center square 3 1/2"


## BLOCK OF THE MONTH



The pastel patch blocks were so cute & cheerful. A true sign that spring is here!

For May we will be making Scrappy Flower blocks. Use floral fabric somewhere in the block. Start with 6" blocks for the petals, then add 2 white 2" squares at the corners to "round off" the petals & add a 2" square for the center. That's it! How fun & simple. See the directions below.

### Scrappy Flower Block

#### Fabric Needed:

Use floral fabric this month (in honor of the spring flowers we are enjoying)

**4 floral petals** – 6" square

**8 white squares** – 2" square

**4 center squares** – 2" square



#### Step 1

On each 6" block, with right sides together, sew 2 white blocks & 1 center block as shown in top right corner.

#### Step 2

Then trim 1/4" outside the seam line toward the corner. Repeat for all 4 blocks.

#### Step 3

Press all corners open.

**Step 4** Sew the blocks together to form your flower as shown to the left.

**Note:** You can put your floral fabric in the flower petals or the flower centers.

## RAINBOW SCRAP CHALLENGE



Dolly Parton said, "The way I see it, if you want the rainbow, you gotta put up with the rain." I say, "If you want a rainbow quilt, you gotta make lots of other pretty quilts so you'll have lots of scraps to make rainbow blocks".

Here's what you need to do, make at least one block (any size you choose) each month in the designated color. At the end of the year, make a rainbow quilt with your 12 different colored blocks. They can all be the same design or a different design each month. We'll let you know around the 1<sup>st</sup> of each month what the color will be for that month.

The color for so far are:

♥ Jan. = Pink

♥ Apr. = Light or Bright Blue

(dark blue & blue green will come later)

♥ July =

♥ Oct. =

♥ Feb. = Yellow

♥ May = Red

♥ Aug. =

♥ Nov. =

♥ Mar. = Green

♥ June =

♥ Sep. =

♥ Dec. =

They have Quarterly sales & sell fabric on the website with the option of picking up order at the store or having it shipped to you. They have someone who come in to do Scissor sharpening & offers local handcrafted tools for sale.
